








#### 1. EDs provide value to a variety of stakeholders

- Care access and safety net
- Care for serviceintensive populations
- Community resilience

- Advanced diagnosis and treatment
- Preservation of inpatient capacity
- Care coordination
- Care innovation



- Improved health outcomes and potential cost savings through timely care and averted hospitalizations
- Timely and comprehensive access
- Reduced barriers to care (financial or bureaucratic)

2. We summarized the evidence on key challenges that EDs face

Increasing care complexity, acuity, and boarding/crowding

Expanding scope of work

Competing stakeholder expectations (throughput, complexity, patient experience)

Workforce challenges

Increase in uncompensated and undercompensated care


Underpayment by insurance administrators and patients

Figure 4.5. Index of Inflation-Adjusted Dollars Paid to ED Professionals per Visit, 2018–2022







4. A tiered strategy for payment can address challenges and enable EDs to continue to provide value
