- 1. Submit a nomination for the 2025 ACEP Award for Outstanding Contribution in Research.
- 2. Provide subject matter expertise to review and submit responses to the NIH's requests for information (RFIs) in collaboration with SAEM's Research Committee.
- 3. Work with CORD, SAEM, EMF, EMRA, and other stakeholders to enhance the research scholar pipeline within emergency medicine and support robust research mentorship opportunities. This objective addresses Substitute Resolution 20(23) Emergency Medicine Research Mentorship Network:

RESOLVED, That ACEP foster collaborations with Society for Academic Emergency Medicine, Council of Residency Directors in Emergency Medicine, and Emergency Medicine Foundation, and other stakeholders to support robust research mentorship opportunities.

- 4. Collaborate with the Clinical Emergency Data Registry Committee and the Emergency Medicine Data Institute Board of Governors in their objective to establish a scientific review committee to develop/refine and apply a process for evaluating joint CEDR/EMDI data requests. (Clinical Emergency Data Registry is the lead committee.)
- 5. Provide subject matter expertise to support the promotion for and awareness of federal funding for emergency medicine research as directed by ACEP legislative staff and in collaboration with SAEM.
- 6. Collaborate with the National/Chapter Relations Committee to support and encourage chapter-based satellite scientific assemblies to promote community-based research. (Research is the lead committee)
- 7. Collaborate with the Academic Affairs Committee in their objective to develop resources or a tool kit to support educational research. (Academic Affairs is the lead committee.)
- 8. Develop strategies of further highlighting research accomplishments by ACEP members and their contributions to the advancement of the specialty.

9. Support staff to implement, integrate, advance, and improve the Research Forum meeting with the goal of promoting increased quality and quantity of EM research and supporting the growth of the physician-scientist workforce.

- 10. Review grant proposals for EMF and recommend applicant funding and provide on-going monitoring of funded grant progress reports.
- 11. Expand the pool of EMF grant reviewers through development of a junior faculty mentorship program and establishment of a list of pre-approved ad hoc reviewers.
