

LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

Members of the ACEP Disaster Medicine Section,

Congratulations on another successful ACEP Scientific Assembly! It was great seeing so many of you in Las Vegas at the Disaster Section meeting, the new Section Crawl, and the various related meetings held throughout. I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your ongoing participation in the Section and to provide some updates after the meeting.

First, we had a successful year internally at ACEP. We were tasked, with our colleagues from the EMS Section, to define for the ACEP Leadership specifically what is the purpose and benefit to the College of the ACEP Department of EMS and Disaster Preparedness. A task force of members was convened to evaluate the Department, the organizational home for the sections and committees for Disaster Medicine, EMS,

Additionally, we successfully lobbied for a change to the name of our department, which is now the ACEP Department of EMS and Disaster Medicine, reflecting the uniqueness of Disaster Medicine as a separate field of study. We look forward to the changes throughout the ACEP website to reflect this new identity.

The meeting included updates from many of our external partners, including the National Center for Disaster Medicine and Public Health, the HHS ASPR, NEMPAC, FICEMS, National Emerging Special Pathogens Training and Education Center, NHTSA, the National Disaster Life Support Foundation, and many others. We look forward to continuing to grow our relationships with this vital organizations in the coming years.

The coming year will require continued dedication from our members and leaders as we work toward achieving our goals with the Section mentorship program, lecture series, and other projects. If you are interested in serving the college on a project, please contact us. Next year at ACEP Scientific Assembly we hope to continue some of the educational content changes to further highlight disaster medicine and disaster research in particular. 


