1. Projects Led by Trainees

- o Speaker: Dr. Anmol Chanda
- Topic: Right Wound, Right Care, Right Time Improving Wound Triage in Trauma ED.
- Focused on improving timeliness and accuracy of wound triage.

2. Projects Ensuring Health Equity

- Speaker: Dr. Maria Raven (UCSF)
- o Topic: ED Psychiatric Model of Care.
- Outcomes: Reduced ED LOS by 33% (~8.7 hrs), preserved resources equivalent to 2 staffed beds/day, increased discharges by 9.3%, and decreased workplace violence incidents.

3. Projects Incorporating Innovative Technology/Care Models

- Speaker: Dr. Suresh Pavuluri on behalf of Dr. Jessica Amoako (Yale)
- o Topic: Pregnancy Hypertension Alert System.
- Outcomes: Reduced median time to treatment from 52 to 19 minutes,
 improved patient flow, and met national guidelines without extending LOS.
