Quarterly Wellness Themes

Resolutions

The Wellness Section submitted two resolutions for Council this year. Each resolution received co-sponsorship from Arizona College of Emergency Physicians, Colorado Chapter, District of Columbia Chapter, and South Carolina Chapter. Wellness Section Councillor, Dr. Kristin Nordenholz presented Resolution 22(24) Support for the "Well Workplace" Policy Statement* and Alternate Councillor, Dr. Harry Severance presented Resolution 41(24) Workplace Violence Data Collection*. The Wellness Section also cosponsored five (5) Resolutions that aligned with the Wellness Section



objectives. They are Resolution 36(24) EMTALA Reform to Improve Patient
Access to Necessary Care, Resolution 49(24) Centralized Repository of
Credentialing Data, Resolution 50(24) Communication to Established Patients
Being Referred to the Emergency Department, Resolution 51(24) Consultant
Communication and Feedback to Referring Emergency Physicians, and
Resolution 57(24) Rationalizing Communication of Imaging Hazards to Improve
Care.*NOTE: All Resolution links above are from the original submission and do

• Summary of 2024 Council Resolutions

Below is the summary of the above resolutions considered by the Council. Two (2) resolutions were not adopted, and the remaining five (5) were adopted as non-bylaws resolutions. **Note**: The first resolved of Resolution 22 was adopted and the second resolved was not adopted.

- Resolutions Not Adopted (NA) or Withdrawn (W)
 - 22(24) Support for the "Well Workplace" Policy Statement second resolved (NA)
 - 51(24) Consultant Communication and Feedback to Referring Emergency Physicians (NA)

Non-Bylaws Resolutions

Resolution 22 Support for the "Well Workplace" Policy Statement – first resolved

• RESOLVED, That ACEP promote, advertise, and support the best practices as defined in the "Well Workplace" policy statement.

Resolution 36 EMTALA Reform to Improve Patient Access to Necessary Care (as amended)

RESOLVED, That ACEP collaborate with the Arizona and Connecticut Chapters and others to develop model state policy, regulation, and legislation, that requires reporting of ED/hospital crowding and interhospital transfer data to a relevant state entity (e.g. State Department of Health) and develop a state-wide system to facilitation interfacility transfers.

Resolution 41 Workplace Violence (in lieu of Resolutions 41 and 42) (as amended)

- RESOLVED, That ACEP advocate for all emergency departments to preserve and protect the accurate reporting of each workplace violence incident while preserving employee confidentiality without repercussion or recrimination for employment purposes; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That ACEP officially work with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the Department of Justice, and other relevant stakeholders to advocate for national legislation that



standardizes the prevention and the response to harmful acts of violence on health care workers in emergency departments.

Resolution 49 Centralized Repository of Credentialing Data (as amended)

- RESOLVED, That ACEP advocate for the establishment of a centralized repository of verified primary source documents, work history, case logs, certificates of insurance, and other materials; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That ACEP work with the American Medical Association, the American Osteopathic Association, the Federation of State Medical Boards, The Joint Commission, American Hospital Association, state agencies, and other interested parties to establish a recognized centralized repository of verified credentialing documents that can be used by all hospitals in the process of credentialing and privileging physicians at their facility that requires a minimum amount of additional submissions by physicians applying for privileges.

Resolution 50 Communication to Established Patients Being Referred to the Emergency Department (as amended)

RESOLVED, That ACEP work with other stakeholders to develop a strategy to address the problem of patients with terminal or end stage diseases being referred to the ED for education and disposition of expected prognosis and disease progression of which they and their families were not educated by the physicians responsible for doing so.

Resolution 57 Rationalizing Communication of Imaging Hazards to Improve Care (as amended)

 RESOLVED, That ACEP work with the American College of Radiology and other stakeholders, to develop a policy statement or other resource information on the rational communication of imaging hazards to emergency patients; and be it further

Well Workplace

The Well-Being Committee's Well Workplace Subcommittee submitted a Well Workplace Policy statement to the ACEP Board of Directors in April 2024. The board approved. This document outlined the key principles and expectations for a supportive workplace and is available for members to share with leaders, department chairs, and C-suite executives. The subcommittee hopes this policy will spark meaningful discussions and drive essential changes within emergency medicine workplaces.

• Shift Scheduling Project

Dr. Vanyo shared an overview of the ACEP Shift Work Project with a goal of performing a qualitative study by interviewing 2-3 people by June 2025. A QR code was shared for interested members to sign-up to learn more or to participate in conducting 2-3 interviews, a time estimate of approx. five (5) hours.



 ACEP Shift Work Project Background Summary: Emergency Physicians (EPs) are consistently exposed to the stress of rotational shift work, deemed by most to be an inevitable part of the job (Klinefelter et al). A multitude of studies have demonstrated the cognitive and health impacts of this work on the individual, as well as negative patient and work safety outcomes (Vidacek, Winget, Dula, Ganeson). One group also explored EPs' perceptions of why they experience fatigue, with shift work being a key component (Klinefelter). Research has touched on potential alterations and innovations to improve the way shifts are scheduled and how we manage vacation time (Krakow, Burgess, Krowther, Sinksy). And yet, no simple, effective or one-size fits all solutions have been uncovered. Given the complexity of shift scheduling to meet both individual and institutional needs, we must understand qualitatively "what works and what doesn't". We seek to explore how EP shifts are managed across multiple geographies and health care institutions and obtain a deeper understanding of shift scheduling and its effects from the perspective of EPs via individual interviews.

- V. The Emergency Medicine Wellness Center Excellence Award is presented to an emergency medicine group, department, or clinical site that incorporates wellness and resilience on an institutional level and to use the information gathered in the nominations process to understand more about wellness best practices. Dr. Savitzky announced and recognized the Department of Emergency Medicine at New York-Presbyterian-Weill Cornell Medicine as the recipient of ACEP's Emergency Medicine Center of Excellence Award. The Emergency Departments at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center was selected by a delegation of



the Well-Being Committee for its commitment to institutional wellness and resiliency.

- VI. The Section's primary focus for 2024-2025 is enhancing section engagement and brainstorming how to improve relationships and operations by sharing real-world problem/solution examples to help members troubleshoot similar issues at their own sites.
